President's Corner

The Post Office announced in September they had applied for certain rate increases to take affect in January 2014. First class domestic rates would increase to 49 cents, additional ounces going up to 21 cents and international rates to \$1.15. As of late November the Postal Regulatory Commission had approved only inflationary based increases. That is, the domestic rate would go from 46 cents to 47 cents. It would seem some increase is in our near future - the amount is yet to be determined.

With the advent of FOREVER stamps and the almost certain increase of rates at some time, if you do any large mailings with modern stamps - stocking up on FOREVER stamps seems advisable.

Cover of The Month

After a recent excursion to Idaho by Phil Kumler and Bill Seymour, we now have rounded out our material for next year's auction. They returned with 11 large boxes of stamps, stamp albums and covers to be included in the auction. The Stamps include some very nice early mint US issues and many plate blocks - with a good selection before Sc. #750.

The covers include many naval, event and postal history covers - as well as some nice FDC's. The Cover of the Month is from a complete set of Prexie FDCs - just the \$5.00 cover is signed by FDR. Very nice.

Telling Everyone About Your Exhibit: The Title Page

Exciting times lie ahead! Your exhibit has been entered into PIPEX 2014 and you can't wait for everyone to see it. Even your neighbors are going to come along! Will they understand what you are going to show, you wonder. It may all depend on your **title page**.

I wrote about the title page in the September 2012 issue, in an article based on the AAPE's educational exhibit, *How to build a Philatelic Exhibit*. In case you can't lay your hands on your copy and want to get your title page right first time, read on!

A good title page consists of:

- 1. an unambiguous **title** that covers the entire exhibit and nothing else
- 2. immediately followed by a clear and brief statement about the **type**, **purpose** and **scope** of the exhibit
- 3. a **plan** that outlines the story of your exhibit
- 4. an appropriate **item** that represents the exhibit or begins the story
- 5. a short statement of **background information** or **historical context** (optional)
- 6. a **note** on how you will indicate significant items in the exhibit

Succinctly explain what you are showing and how you are showing it (**type** of exhibit and its **purpose**) and define the boundaries of the exhibit (**scope**). Use your **purpose** statement as your 25 word description on your PIPEX entry form, for inclusion in the show's program.

The **plan** (outline) is essential for helping the viewer find his or her way around the exhibit. An effective plan can be used as a list of the headings displayed throughout the exhibit. Your neighbors should be

able to follow it, just as easily as the judges.

Display an **item** (not necessarily philatelic) that captures the essence of what your exhibit is about as a visual way to get your message across.

You may also need to add a short paragraph of **background information** or **historical context** to set the scene, but only if it is necessary and you have room after all the above has been added. If you find yourself going on and on here, then put this information in the synopsis instead.

Let the viewer know your "**code**" for indicating items that are rare or hard to find. These are the items you have bragged about in your synopsis and the judges will be looking for them, so make it easy for them to find your gems. Here are some ideas:

- boxes (thicker, doublelined or colored if you have drawn boxes around all your material)
- dots or diamonds (possibly colored)
- matting, possibly in a stronger color (or even double matting if your whole exhibit is matted)

Keep in mind that the title page is the most important page of your exhibit. It needs to be the **first** page you make and the **last** to be edited, as that is where you are defining your exhibit.


