

PIPEX 2014 is almost here. A great deal of time and effort has gone into the planning for this show. Michael Dixon and Tony Wawrukiewicz and the rest of Portland Philatelic Exhibitions board, should be heartily congratulated for assembling an impressive show. The highlights of the show include two Inverted Jennys, a wide variety of exceptional exhibits, a Harmer-Schau auction and a bourse including national as well as regional dealers. See the article by Lucien Klein on pages 8-9 for more details. This may not be the show of the decade for us (since the APS StampShow is due here in 2016), but it may be a close second. Do not miss it. Come all three days if you can. There will be plenty to see and do. The view of the River and the I-5 bridge from the exhibit hall isn't bad either.

Cover of The Month

The cover of the month doesn't actually exist yet. The design of the cover emphasizes one of the major 'draws' for PIPEX this year. With two Inverted Jennys at one show, the opportunity to commemorate the event drove the design to include both a C3a and a pictorial postmark to complement the franking of last years \$2.00 Inverted Jenny issue. Seemed appropriate to have the Inverted Jenny "flying" over a nice view of the Columbia Gorge. The covers will be in color and we plan to prepare just 150 - 75 #'d covers for each of the two days the Bridal Veil Station post office will be at PIPEX. If you are not able to attend PIPEX, you may purchase a cover by writing to OSS, 4828 NE 33rd Ave., Portland OR 97211 (while supplies last). The cost per cover is \$5.00 (free shipping). Proceeds from the sale of the covers will benefit the Bridal Veil Historical Society and the Oregon Stamp Society.

Two 1929 Letters – Airmail in U.S., Surface Overseas, then Airmail in Europe

(editor: This is the first in a series of articles based on the one page material included in the OSS one frame exhibit for PIPEX 2014)

Universal United States and worldwide airmail service began as a somewhat comprehensive service in 1924. Prior to this year, such service was often experimental and/or fragmented. Even the service that began around 1924 was somewhat fragmented in that there was no overseas airmail service but rather only airmail service within a land mass (such as the U.S. and Europe) with only surface connections across the intervening oceans. This complexity existed until the late 1930s when more uniform rates began to develop. Unfortunately, this latter development was then interrupted by WWII and did not really settle into a uniform system until 1946.

The rates that developed from 1924-1939 were voluminous because the Universal Postal Union was not party to them, and, instead, many different entities such as different countries and airline systems were responsible for setting them up. This has resulted in the large books of tables that have been developed (such as my International rate book) in order to document them all. Because of this complexity, it was difficult for postal clerks to be certain that the postage they collected for a particular complex mixed service was correct. Therefore, finding correctly franked items is not easy.

In this article I show two of the three ways that letters from the U.S. received airmail service in 1929. Both letters received air service in the U.S. but only one received air service in Europe. The first cover, in Figure #1 was an-up-to-one-ounce letter from Oakland, Cal. to Switzerland. 13ϕ were paid, an amount that covered the 4ϕ per ounce airmail service across the continental U.S. (airmail surcharge for this), the 5ϕ per ounce surface service across the Atlantic Ocean, and 4ϕ for the 4ϕ per ounce airmail service from London to Switzerland. These rates were in place from Sept. 2, 1927 until July 4, 1930.



The second example of these services is illustrated in Figure #2. This is a Dec. 11, 1929 up-to-one-ounce letter sent from Merced, Cal. to Denmark. In this case 9ϕ were paid, an amount that again covered the 4ϕ per ounce airmail service across the continental U.S. and the 5ϕ per ounce surface service across the Atlantic Ocean. Since no additional postage was paid, the remaining service to Denmark was by surface. In fact this is indicated by the two purple lines through the 'VIA AIR MAIL' endorsement, lines that indicate that no further airmail service was available for this letter.



received from 1924 to 1939 and even later.

The description of the service received for these two covers only scratches the surface of the complications that one finds as one attempts to understand the international airmail service that letters

For youth, free stamps by the bucket will be offered each day of the show. Boy Scout merit badge classes will be held on Saturday, May 10.


For adults, the show, each day, offers StampBuddy for beginning or returning adult collectors.

The American Air Mail Society and The China Stamp Society will hold their annual meetings at PIPEX 2014. Organizations

holding regional meetings/programs at the show include Northwest Philatelic Library, American Association of Philatelic Exhibitors, Universal Ship Cancellation Society, Pacific Northwest Postal History Society, and the Auxiliary Markings Club. PIPEX is the annual exhibition of the Northwest Federation of Stamp Clubs, which will hold its annual general meeting at the show.

As a World Series of Philately show, the grand award winner's exhibit is expected to compete in the Champion of Champions competition at StampShow 2014 in Hartford, Connecticut. The show awards banquet will take place Saturday evening at the show hotel. Reservations are required and can be made by contacting Steve Brandt at: zbear@att.net. Early reservations are encouraged because the event may sell out before the show opens.

Belgian Railway Parcel Post Stamps

Ever wonder why the railway parcel post stamps of Belgium are so plentiful? How such a small country would have such a need for so many parcel post stamps? Questions like these and the appearance of these train stamps with very large cancels have fueled my collecting of them for several decades. I recently acquired a 2003 monograph from the Belgian Study Circle in the UK. It is an update of the 1974 publication by Tom Jones "The Railway Parcel Post Cancellations of Belgium". It will be the basis for a series of articles beginning next

month. As a teaser, these two illustrations are of labels which were applied to "waybills" (shipping documents) for parcels. Parcel post

stamps were affixed and cancelled to the "waybills". The 'wine glass' indicated "Fragile" contents and the 'chicken, dog and bull' label was used for live animals.




