## Story of the Ill-Fated SS Stanvac Melbourne By Steve King

Recently I acquired a packet of 16 airmail covers sent by a crewmember of a New York-owned steamship tanker operating in South America to his wife in Pittsburgh. What makes the collection significant is the covers were posted just before and after the Pearl Harbor attack and the entry of the U.S. into WWII. The history of the tanker vessel, *SS Stanvac Melbourne*, is important to telling this story.

James W. Bridges made trips into South America on the *Stanvac Melbourne* with stops at various ports. The ship was transporting petroleum fuel products. The sixteen covers' route began in Santos, Brazil in September-November 1941; then through the Panama Canal in December 1941; and then Peru and Chile December 1941-February 1942.

Our subject cover (Figure 1) was posted in Cristobal, Canal Zone, December 2, 1941 and sent via PanAir franked with Scott C10 and cancelled with the "Gateway of World Trade" slogan cancel.

The SS Stanvac Melbourne (Figure 2) was a 10,103 gross ton tanker with a hold capacity of 132,500 barrels. It was a Panamanian-flagged vessel home-ported in Panama City. It was built in 1941 by the Sun Shipbuilding and Drydock Co. in Chester, Pennsylvania and owned by the New York company, Socony-Vacuum Oil Co., later becoming Sonoco, the largest distributor of petroleum products in the nation.

The 16 covers were flown out of South America via PanAir (Pan American Airways), then to Pittsburgh. The famed China Clipper flying boats did not fly into Central or South America. Other aircraft and crews were used on these routes (Figure 3).

The Boeing 307 Stratoliner entered service for Pan American Airways July 1940. It is likely our cover collection was flown on the Boeing 307. The image of a four-engine plane on the covers matches the design of the Boeing 307 (figure 4).

The fifth cover by date was airposted December 8, 1941 in Talara, Peru, the date the U.S. declared war on the Empire of Japan. War was declared on Germany on December 11.

President Roosevelt signed an Executive Order on December 19, 1941 establishing the Office of Censorship. U.S. censor stations were established for examining foreign mail destined for the US in Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands, Panama, and the Canal Zone.

The earliest US censored cover in the collection is postmarked Jan. 19, 1942 from Chile (Figure 4). Another from Peru is postmarked Feb. 18, 1942 (Figure 5). It is likely these are some of the earliest dates recorded for U.S. censored mail from these countries.

On April 12, 1942, German submarine U-203, operating off the coast of North Carolina torpedoed the *Stanvac Melbourne* traveling in ballast and unescorted enroute from New York to Aruba, NWI Curacao. On board was a complement of 40 crewmembers and eight U.S. naval armed guards. Three crewmembers were lost while abandoning ship. The ship was crippled but not sunk. Repairs were undertaken at Charleston, SC and the ship returned to service July 2, 1942.

A second attack, this time by German submarine U-515 off Trinidad occurred Sept. 12, 1942. The one year-old ship again was in ballast and unescorted enroute from Brazil to Aruba. The ship was sunk. Her complement included 40 crewmembers and nine U.S. naval guards. One crewmember was lost. We do not know the status of James Bridges at the time of the two torpedo events. It is likely he was aboard but his name did not appear on the lists of crewmembers lost.

The Master of the *Stanvac Melbourne* was Andrew T. Lagan who survived both attacks and, after losing his vessel, became the master of the *Motor Tanker Brilliant*, also owned by Socony-Vacuum Oil Co. Lagan did not survive his third torpedo attack. On November 18, 1942, enroute from New York to Belfast carrying 90,704 barrels of fuel oil, the German submarine U-43 attacked and fatally struck, but did not sink the *Brilliant*.

The ship limped into St. Johns, Newfoundland, arriving November 24, 1942. The ship, while undertow to a repair facility, encountered heavy seas and broke apart. The forepart immediately sank carrying Master Lagan and ten others to their deaths.

In 1943 and 1944 in the North Atlantic, all three of the attacking submarines were sunk by U.S. and British naval forces. The majority of the crewmembers on U-203 and U-515 were rescued by the attacking forces. All 55 crew members on U-43 perished.

A Stanvac Melbourne II was built and operated from 1947 to 1960.





## A Personal Letter Sent via Diplomatic Pouch **Bv Dennis Ladd**



This cover, sent by an American embassy staffer, has a 1953 Washington, D.C. cancellation but carries a Jordan stamp (Scott no. 283). An article written by David M. Frye in the October 2018 issue of Auxiliary Markings explains the sending of personal mail via diplomatic pouch:

The practice at the time entailed such personal mail traveling from U.S. diplomatic offices in secured, diplomatic pouches sent as air cargo. Letters needed to bear current and sufficient postage for the country of origin. They received postmarks in Washington D.C.

Note: 1953 was the year that King Hussein ascended to the throne at the age of 17. He ruled through decades of Mideast chaos until his death in February 1999.
